14-DAY PROGRAM

1

Guests arrival to Khartoum international airport and transfer to hotel in Khartoum.

2

Khartoum & Omdurman city tour: it is a one-day tour covering the national museum, ethnographic museum, Khalifa's house museum in Omdurman, and the confluence of the two Niles (Blue Nile & white Nile) at the evening and finally return to the hotel.

3

Naqa'a Museum – Marawe: Drive to the ancient cultic center of Naqa'a with the merotic temple of Amun, the Roman chapel and the lion temple, which is located about 160km. from over there we proceed to Musawarat as-Sufra around 20km and it is an extensive temple area elephant depictions. Afterwards we continue to the small town of Shendi, which is located about 80km from Musawarat, and onwards we drive about 30km to Marawe where we visit the largest pyramid cemetery of the Nile valley – dozens of black pyramids rise from the desert sands. We will spend a night in tents in front of the pyramids of Marawe.

4

Marawe – Damar – Bayoudha Desert – Dier Ghazali – Karima: In the morning, it is an opportunity to take a stroll and photograph the pyramids. Then we drive to Damar which is 100km far from Marawe, crossing the Nile to Umm Tuyur on the west bank. Afterwards we drive taking the route leads through the Bayoudha desert for about 400km to visit the ancient mastery of Deir Ghazal, then drive to Nuri, 25km to visit the cemetery containing the pyramids of the 26th dynasty, among them that of Pharaoh Taharqa. Afterwards we drive to Karima to spend a night at Nubian houses.

5

DAYS: Crossing the Nile to visit the necropolis of el-Kumu which is 18 km from Karima, the subterranean tomb of King Tarwetamani that is decorated in the classical pharaonic style. Drive to Jebel Barkal located about 18 km from Karima to ascend Jebel Barkal. Afterwards we visit the great temple of Amun of Napata dating back to the 12th century B.C.; the temple was the most important religious center of Kush civilization. We will again drive back to Karima to spend a night in a Nubian houses.

6

Karma: Drive from Karima crossing the desert to Karma, which is located about 300 km, to spend a night at Nubian houses.

7

Karma – Messaida – Soleb: Drive to Karma, capital of Upper Nubia during the 3rd and 2nd millennium B.C. The "Difufa", large mud brick constructions slightly younger than the Giza pyramids, were probably tombs. Drive to the village of Karma for provisions, then proceed to Messaida, 18 km, and visit an old Christian chapel. Drive north through colorful Nubian villages to Delgo, 80 km, crossing the Nile, Nile then 70 km drive to Soleb to spend a night in the house of the Nubian houses.

8

Soleb – Sadinga – Sai – Soleb: visit the temple of Soleb, a Nubian copy of the temples of the Egyptian New Kingdom, with pillars reminiscent of Luxor temple. Drive to Sadinga, 50 km and visit to the temple dedicated to Queen Teje, the mother of Akhenaten. Afterwards we take a boat trip to the island of Sai, 40 km, with settlement ruins from old Nubian, Pharaonic and Christian times. Afterwards we return to Soleb and drive through the desert along the old Darb el-Arabain, the "Road of Forty" – a camel took 40 days from Khartoum to Cairo on this road. We spend a night in the Nubian Houses.

9/10

Soleb – Seseebi – Sebu – Tumbus: Turn back 50km to Seseebi which is a military outpost of Pharaoh Akhenaten. We cross the Nile near Delgo and 30 km to drive to the 3rd cataract. We will take photo stop at the rapids and 50 km then take drive to Tumbus, passing prehistoric rock inscriptions near Sebu. Visit to hieroglyphic inscriptions and a recumbent statue of King Taharka in the granite quarries. We spend two nights in Karma at Nubian houses.

11

Tumbus – Kawa – Old Dongola: Drive from Tumbus to Karma to buy provisions, then on to Kawa, 120 km to see the sand-covered temple ruins. Afterwards proceed to the Old Dongola, tent overnight.

12

Old Dongola – Wadi Milk: Visit old Dongola, once the Christian capital of the Nubian kingdom Makuria and later a major Islamic city. Afterwards drive to the spectacularly beautiful desert valley of Wadi Milk. Often once meets Bisharin Bedouin watering their camels at one of the wells. We spend a night in tent.

13

Wadi Milk – Khartoum: After breakfast we have an opportunity to take a walk; then drive back to Khartoum and we arrive late in the afternoon to the hotel.
